Shivers down my spine


Off the rungs



RAISING A CONCERN

A reminder for our school community. If, at any time, you find that you have a concern with the school, you are encouraged to come to the school and speak with the teacher/s, Leaders of Learning, Ms Deb Sheridan or Mrs Jenny Bellenger, to identify your concern. It is our aim to work with all members of our school community to ensure that we do the very best to provide a productive, safe and enjoyable learning experience for our students and a professionally fulfilling experience for our staff.


Fees: Contribution of \$20 per child to cover lesson materials and certificate.



Step 3 Find our school


Our school will appear in 'Nearby Locations' if you're within 10kms of the school, or search for our school by name.
