#### PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

Dear Parents and Carers,

This week we celebrate NATIONAL CHILD PROTECTION WEEK. The theme of the 30th anniversary of this important week is: Putting children first. The same theme that was used to launch the very first campaign.

'The aim of the week is to bring abuse and neglect out of the shadows and put children's wellbeing on the national agenda'.

Under this year's theme of 'Putting children first' all Australians are encouraged to look at how they can prioritise children in their lives and communities and to engage in National Child Protection Week.

Putting children first means prioritising the safety and wellbeing of children. To grow up well children need to feel safe and loved, have a chance to play and explore, have a say in decisions that affect them, and access to essential things like food, shelter and healthcare.

For children to thrive we need to come together as a community and put children's needs first during National Child Protection Week and every week.

At St Francis all staff are mandatory reporters and we have policies and procedures in place to ensure the safety of all our students at the school. Along with our PBS4L focus, we have Well-being, Pastoral Care and Child Protection Policies which are available for any member of the community upon request.

Throughout the year all teachers focus on two very important concepts with their students:

Everyone has the right to feel safe.

There is nothing so awful that you can't tell someone else (parent, teacher, relative or another trusted adult)

Depending on the age of students the following will be discussed:

Personal space – body boundaries mean you don't have to hug or kiss anyone, even 'Great Grandma' if you don't want to. You are the boss of your own body.

Body safety – no one has the right to ask to see or touch your private parts. If they do, yell 'no' or 'stop' and run to tell a trusted adult.

Emotional awareness – be aware of what happens in our bodies when we become scared or uncomfortable. Not feeling 'right' or feeling 'uncomfortable' are warning signs.

Secrets – no one should ever keep secrets that make them feel bad or uncomfortable. You are allowed to share a 'bad' secret with trusted adults.

Safety networks – who is in your safety network? Who can you tell if you feel uncomfortable or have seen something that you didn't want to? The 'helping hand' or 'network hand' assists children to identify individuals or services that can assist them. The children write the name of one trusted adult on each finger, who they can ask for help if they feel unsafe. In the palm or web of the hand older students may include details for <a href="Kids Helpline">Kids Helpline</a> 1800 55 1800 or Emergency 000.

We greatly value the support of parents and carers in providing a safe school environment. The National Association to Prevent Child Abuse & Neglect (NAPCAN) is an organisation dedicated to preventing Child Abuse and Neglect. Their website has useful resources, contacts and information to inform, guide and assist parents in this important area. #### **UPDATED COVID 19 INFORMATION FROM CEDP**

#### **Important Self Isolation Information**

Advice about how to manage self-isolation, particularly with siblings, is available from <u>NSW Health</u> and from the Western Sydney Local Health District <u>Community Resources website</u>. Importantly:

In most cases, siblings of students identified as a close contact are able to return to school as normal unless they also have been identified as a 'close contact' by NSW Health or are not able to isolate from the sibling who is a confirmed close contact;

Where families find it difficult to isolate siblings from other family members who are a confirmed close contact of someone with COVID-19, the sibling should not attend school during the period of isolation;

If a parent/carer is unable to isolate effectively from a child identified as a close contact, they should not attend work during the close contact's isolation period. Family members of close contacts are asked to keep a very close watch for COVID-19 symptoms and follow the advice provided previously about what action to take if they have concerns.

#### **Vertical Student Groupings**

Recent advice from NSW Health requires schools to keep students in Year or Staged groups wherever possible. While this is often very challenging in a school setting, it is designed to minimise the risk of spreading infection through the school, should a member of the school community acquire COVID-19.

#### **Parent/Carer Contact Information**


It is very important that our school's parents/carers contact data is kept up to date should it need to be used quickly. Please contact the school as a matter of urgency if your contact details have changed. If we had a reported positive COVID-19 at St Francis all family details are required so that parents and carers receive communication quickly in a timely manner. As you can appreciate, this might also be required out of normal school hours.

## Safety & Hygiene

At St Francis we will continue to follow the guidelines from NSW Health. The guidelines are:

- Vigilance in ensuring that staff and students do not attend school or work if they are unwell.
- Exclude students and staff with even mild symptoms of COVID-19.
- Encourage immediate testing for any symptomatic child(ren) or staff.
- Students absent or sent home due to flu like symptoms need to be COVID-19 tested.
- Staff and students must not return to school or work until they return a negative COVID-19 test result and are symptom free .
- Schools must sight the negative COVID-19 test result prior to allowing students and staff to return to school.
- Prohibit return to school for anyone with symptoms of COVID-19 until a negative COVID test result has been reported.
- Ensure that adults maintain physical distancing at all times.
- Ensure good hand hygiene at all times (e.g. upon entry to the school, entry to the classroom and upon exit of the classroom).

Schools should limit activities to Year or Stage groups whenever possible. (....continued next page)

## **UPDATED COVID 19 INFORMATION FROM CEDP (continued)**

## **School Operations and School Related Activity**

Some of the changes required from schools are:

- Students to stay within their relevant cohort, year group for all learning activities.
- Schools must not travel outside of their local community area or zone for all inter school activities.
- Some group activities such as choirs, changing and the use of wind instruments in a group setting are not permitted.
- Dance activities will require risk assessments and a COVID-19 Safety Plan.
- A Year 6 or Year 12 graduation assembly is allowed with restrictions.

### **Guidance for Community Use and Visitors to the School**

Some of the changes required from schools are:

- P&F social events or functions are no longer permitted.
- All community user groups must have a COVID-19 Safety Plan.

# **Stopping of Certain Practices**

Certain practices must cease altogether. These include:

- Activities that result in the mixing of students from schools in different regions, such as sporting-related activities, drama and debating.
- School-related overnight events (e.g. retreats, camps, excursions) as there is increased risk of transmission of the virus in a residential type setting with shared facilities.
- School-related social activities (e.g. school formals, dinners or dances; graduation ceremonies; or parent engagement functions).

#### **Additional Advice**

Schools are advised that Kindergarten orientation and transition to school activities remain on hold until further notice. Advice is being developed to support schools to consider alternate ways to engage families and children in preparation for starting school in 2021.

  advise number of children you want to register. Do not email
  registration form.
- Only one parent/carer must attend as we are required to observe physical distancing. Children do not need to come.

# All children require a Sponsor:

Must be baptised, practicing catholic, 18 years and over. Godparents and siblings can be sponsors. All sponsors must be present during Rehearsal.

## Confirmation Name:

All children must choose a Saint's name as their Confirmation name. It is advisable for the children to know something about their chosen Saint. If your child is baptised with a Christian name, eg: Matthew, Mark or John, there is no need to choose another Saint's name.

# Age of Children:

Must be 10 years of age. Please note: if your child is over 10 years old and just received their 1<sup>st</sup> Holy Communion in 2020, Confirmation must be deferred to 2021.

It is a requirement by the Diocese that children can receive One Sacrament per year.

## Fees:

Contribution of \$15 per child to cover lesson materials and certificate.

#### Categories

All entries can be either poetry or short stories. They will be judged in the following age categories, 8 - 11 years, 12 - 14 years, 15 - 17 years and adult (18+).

#### Judging

Your work will be judged on how original it is, how you have constructed your story or poem, the use of language, (including creative expression, grammar, sentence structure, punctuation and spelling) and the way you have developed characters, atmosphere, or setting or used words in a creative way.

It is critical that this work is original and not copied in any way. Copied work will be disqualified. An independent judging panel will assess all submissions.
