

PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

Dear Parents and Carers,

Teachers are currently working on the students Half Yearly Semester Learning Reports, which will be sent home to parents on Monday 21st June 2021. In previous years our Student Progress Reports have been created in a platform known as FACES. In light of system changes at CEDP and the closure of the FACES platform, schools throughout the Diocese of Parramatta are moving to Compass Reporting.

Compass is the new platform system CEDP uses for communication to parents. It is the system we use to send home information and for attendance.

The appearance of the report will look different to previous report formats.

The Year 1-6 report will no longer consist of an A-E scale. This scale has been replaced by words describing the student's level of achievement as follows:

Outstanding Achievement; High Achievement; Sound Achievement; Basic Achievement; Experiencing Difficulty.

It is important to remember that the majority of students are expected to receive Sound Achievement grades which indicate that they are achieving the expected outcomes for their stage of learning.

There will also be an effort grade displayed in each Key Learning Area. A lot of time and consideration is put into allocating the grades for each student. Grades are allocated based on a number of variables such as student work samples, assessment tasks, observations and class work.

Please keep in mind that your child's grades may have varied from previous years, especially if they have moved into a new stage this year (Year 1, Year 3, 5)

Living Life to the Full: our Draft New Curriculum for Religious Education

For several years now, our Catholic community has been working together to update the way we share our faith with children and young people. This draft new curriculum for Religious Education will be known as Living Life to the Full and is now available on the Catholic Education Diocese of Parramatta website together with a guide to help community members learn more.

Faithful to Sacred Scripture and Tradition, Catholic Teaching and Values, *Living Life to the Full* is designed to be age-appropriate for children and young people. When it is launched in late 2021 the Draft New Curriculum will replace 'Sharing Our Story', the current curriculum that has been in place for more than 20 years.

It is in partnership we can do great things for our children in our care.

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION DRAFT CURRICULUM UPDATE

~ Living Life to the Full ~

"I have come so that they may have life and have it to the full."

John 10:10

Over the last two years, schools in the Catholic Diocese have been trialling the implementation of the new draft curriculum in their schools. We are very pleased to announce that this approach to sharing our Catholic faith with the next generation has been named for the first time. The curriculum will be known as *Living Life to the Full*, a scriptural reference to Jesus' words in John 10:10: "I have come so that they may have life and have it to the full." As Bishop Vincent says, this reflects "the richness of our Catholic Tradition that enables fullness of life through the Gospel".

Living Life to the Full will replace '*Sharing Our Story*', the Religious Education curriculum that has been in place in the Diocese of Parramatta for 20 years. Faithful to Sacred Scripture and Tradition, Catholic Teaching and Values, *Living Life to the Full* is designed to be age-appropriate for children and young people.

This is a work in progress: as a draft, changes will also continue to be made based on feedback from clergy, parents, teachers, students and friends. As a system, we very much appreciate the interest of our Catholic community in bringing the Gospel to children and young people in Western Sydney and the Blue Mountains.

WHY IS MY CHILD'S TEACHER OUT OF CLASS?

Like professionals in other fields, all teachers are required to keep up to date with current thinking on best practices and new developments in areas such as technology. From time to time teachers are required to attend professional development opportunities to learn about changes to curriculum, new methods of teaching and learning, and other ways of integrating technology. These sessions sometimes occur during the day, after school or in the school holidays. Teachers also have entitlements such as long service leave, maternity leave, family leave, sick leave, bereavement leave, jury duty etc. Consequently, there will be times when your child's teacher is absent from the classroom. On these days the teacher's program and day book is followed. Teachers on a grade work closely together allowing the grade partner to liaise with the relief teacher so that good teaching and learning continues, and routines are kept. We thank you for your support in this matter.

PARKING AROUND THE SCHOOL

Please remember the road rules around the school when dropping off and picking up your children.

If you are using the car pick up/drop off area, please remember that is not a parking area. Do not double park next to other cars and do not leave your car. In the morning parents should pull up, drop off their children, and then leave. **Do not get out of the car.** Students will need to walk into school on their own if using this option. If you need to get out of the car, you will need to find parking elsewhere.

When picking up your children in the afternoon, parents form a queue on Armitage Drive. Please do not cut in on the queue, as this only upsets parents who have been patiently waiting their turn. Please go to the end of the line. Do not get out of the car. Children using car pick up need to be able to enter the car from the curb side safely and do up their own seatbelt. If they need assistance to get in the car or do up their seat belt you will need to use an alternative method of pick up.

To parents who walk in to collect their children from the Stone Street parent collect, please do not cross the road through the car pick up area. If you need to cross on Armitage Drive please use the pedestrian crossing to the right of the gate.

Also, please do not park in the staff car park near the office under any circumstances. This is strictly for staff only.

LABELLING ITEMS

After the expense of purchasing uniform items, there is nothing worse than the loss or misplacement of them. More often than not, it has just been left in the school playground or been picked up by another child. Avoid undue stress and ensure **ALL BELONGINGS** are clearly labelled with your child's name. If items are labelled they are put into our lost property box, and these items will be returned to the appropriate children.
