A MESSAGE FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Dear Parents and Carers,

Last week we celebrated Catholic Schools Week. The students participated in a class liturgy and throughout the week they did a variety of activities to celebrate this special week. In previous years, parents were invited into the learning spaces to see all the wonderful things their children do at school. Unfortunately, this year that was not possible due to both COVID and the building construction of our new school. We do hope parents appreciate and understand we have limited space this year and need to be mindful around the NSW health advice around social distancing.

We do appreciate it is difficult for parents not being able to connect with class teachers and see what the children are learning in their spaces. Therefore, the staff are currently organising a parent video for each grade to inform parents what is happening with the learning and for parents to see who their child's teacher is. These videos will be made available through Skoolbag and Facebook.

In October 1820 Irish priest, Fr John Therry put his "Faith in the Future" when he founded the first Catholic school in Australia. That school, run by a former convict, George Marley, which Catholic historians believe was in Hunter Street, Parramatta, had 31 students. By 1833 the number of Catholic schools in the colony had grown to 10.

In 2021, in the Parramatta Diocese alone there are 84 Catholic Schools providing quality learning and teaching in a faith-centred environment.

At St Francis, just one of those 84 schools, we are blessed with highly professional and dedicated teachers who see their role as educators in a catholic school as a vocation. Their commitment to each and every child in the school can be evidenced by the way in which the teachers nurture the relationships that they build and the way in which they focus on each individual child's needs and capabilities.

During this year of celebrating 200 Years of Catholic Education in Australia we pray.....

"In the century ahead grant those teaching and Learning in our schools....

And the families that entrust their young people to us,

A love of learning and a willingness to be the face of Christ In the world of tomorrow. Pour out your abundant blessings upon all involved"

Our role as teachers and parents is to keep children safe, while at the same time encouraging their independence. This can be a delicate balance, and a challenge for us all to navigate at times.

Personal Safety is a component within our Personal development, Health and Physical Education syllabus for all stages of learning. The syllabus states that all children can learn ways to keep themselves safe. In schools we refer to this as Protective Behaviours.

There are two main themes that are taught from Kindergarten to Year 6 in the Protective Behaviours program:

'We all have the right to feel safe all the time.'

'We can talk with someone about anything, no matter what it is.

At St Francis we want to empower all our students to be able to assert their right to feel safe, listen to what their body tells them and to follow up by taking action to either solve problems on their own or to seek assistance from a trusted adult. There are four core content areas that every grade focus on with examples determined by the age of the students


Protective Behaviours is revisited in all classrooms throughout the year.



Anaphylaxis is a serious and rapid allergic reaction usually involving more than one part of the body. St Francis currently has students who can suffer severe allergic reactions (life-threatening) through contact with nuts. As we endeavour to provide for the different needs of all our students, your cooperation is invited to assist the school in supporting and catering for the needs of these particular students, and any future students, by providing your child only with foods that are nut free.



If your child is anaphylactic, please provide the school office with an Action Plan from your doctor and Epi-pen if required. Action Plans are to be updated each year.

FOR GIRLS

A checked tunic, yellow long sleeved shirt, navy blue jacket or V-neck jumper, tie and navy blue tights.

FOR BOYS

A yellow long sleeved shirt with the school logo, navy blue pants, a tie and the navy blue jacket or V-neck jumper.

NAPLAN

All schools participating in the NAPLAN Online in 2020 are expected to take part in a practice test on Thursday 25th March 2021. The practice test is a trial-run and preparation for NAPLAN Online and will provide students with an opportunity to become familiar with the types of questions they will experience.

The practice tests include an omnibus test (combination of Reading, Conventions of Language and Numeracy questions) and a Writing test, both approximately 40 minutes in length. All students in Years 5, 7 and 9 are expected to complete both tests. Year 3 students will only participate in the omnibus test.

In advance of taking NAPLAN Online, students, teachers and parents are invited to use the public demonstration tests (link below) to familiarise themselves with the type of questions and related functionalities available in the NAPLAN Online assessment.
