A MESSAGE FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Dear Parents and Carers,

Over the past two Tuesdays we have welcomed our 2023 Kindergarten parents and students to our St Francis community as they attended our Transition to School program. It is such a privilege to commence this journey with the families of our next Kindergarten group.

We look forward to the last transition visit next week on Tuesday 22nd November.

This Sunday we celebrate the feast of Christ the King. In the gospel, we hear a recount of Jesus dying on the cross. Both the soldiers and the crowd that was watching mocked him. Above him is a sign that says, "This is the King of the Jews."

This gospel reminds us that Jesus was a different type of King. He did not have a crown or the trappings of wealth. He did not even surround himself with wealthy and important people. He came to be with the outcast and the poor. Jesus gives us the example of a servant king.

In the gospel Jesus invited one of the thieves on the cross to join him in paradise that day. He invites each one of us to also join him in paradise but first we are asked to go out and promote the kingdom of God. This is not always easy. We need to pray to God for help to live the life of Jesus' example.

It reminds us of St Francis' words....

"Preach the Gospel at all times and when necessary use words"

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke 23:35-43

Lord remember me when you come into your kingdom. The people stayed there before the cross watching Jesus. As for the leaders, they jeered at him. 'He saved others,' they said, 'let him save himself if he is the Christ of God, the Chosen One.' The soldiers mocked him too, and when they approached to offer him vinegar they said, 'If you are the king of the Jews, save yourself.' Above him there was an inscription: 'This is the King of the Jews.'

One of the criminals hanging there abused him. 'Are you not the Christ?' he said. 'Save yourself and us as well.' But the other spoke up and rebuked him. 'Have you no fear of God at all?' he said. 'You got the same sentence as he did, but in our case we deserved it: we are paying for what we did. But this man has done nothing wrong. Jesus,' he said, 'remember me when you come into your kingdom.' 'Indeed, I promise you,' he replied, 'today you will be with me in paradise.'

GOSPEL REFLECTION by Dianne Bergant CSA

This feast celebrates the power and authority of Christ by creating a collage of images that capture one or more characteristics of Christ's kingship. Each image reinterprets the concept of king, investing it with new meaning. Gathered together they create a kind of litany that extols the kingship of Christ.

Shepherd and commander call to mind the care and protection that Christ lavishes on those who place themselves under his care. King of Israel is a sign of universal rule. Image of the Invisible God acclaims the divine origin of Christ and of the rule that he exercises over all. First born of all Creation places Christ over the entire created world. Source of all Created Things acknowledges both the sovereignty of Christ and his importance as the model after which all things were fashioned. Head of the Body, the Church underscores the intimacy and interrelationship that exist between Christ and all those who are joined to him through faith and baptism. Firstborn of the Dead not only acclaims Christ's resurrection, but it also guarantees the resurrection of those who will follow him into death. Crucified King is clearly the image that reinterprets all other images.

The entire liturgical year is brought to completion in the last words of the gospel: 'Today you will be with me in Paradise.' These are the words that we all long to hear, words that are empty when coming from one who has no authority, but charged with power when spoken by the one who is king over us all.

It is in partnership we can do great things for the students in our care.
