A MESSAGE FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Dear Parents and Carers,

Welcome back to Term 4. It was wonderful to see our students return to school with enthusiasm and interest in their learning. Only a few reluctant ones, some nerves, which is not uncommon. I am sure with the help of your positive reassurance those butterflies in the tummy will soon settle.

If there are any issues, please speak to your child's teacher. We are all looking forward to having a happy, successful and productive term.

Congratulations to the students who continue to wear their uniform with pride. Please support the school by sending your child to school in their complete summer uniform or sports uniform. If at any time there is an issue with part of their uniform, please send them to school in the uniform that is complete.

It is important for your child's wellbeing and academic progress that they attend school regularly and complete each school day. Children need to attend school every day from 8:55am until 3:00pm unless illness prevents their attendance. Please ensure that appointments are made outside of school hours in order to ensure that your child can maximise their learning potential.

Learning takes place from 8:55am until the final bell at 3:00pm. Being late or taking your child early from school, particularly on a regular basis, may hinder their personal and academic progress. This is often reflected in school reports. Parents taking their children out of school on a regular basis will be contacted by the Principal. Should you need to take your child out of school early on an unavoidable occasion, a note should be sent into the class teacher. This will minimise the interruption to learning time for all students. Please avoid disruption to teachers and students by arriving unexpectedly to pick up children without prior notice.

This term our focus once again is on quality teaching and learning making sure that the best opportunities are available for our children to learn. We want our children to be focussed and passionate about learning. This term is also a time of consolidation of their learning together with the ongoing assessment of their learning. It is important that the children can talk about their learning together with self-assessing and knowing what they know, what is the next step in the learning and what they have to do to improve.

It is important that we as parents take the time to talk to our children about what they are learning and what they want to improve. At the same time, it is important to have some time for fun. A sense of humour is one of the healthiest and most powerful methods to help provide perspective on life's difficult experiences. A positive and relaxed spirit can assist us to get through challenging problems and conflicts.

2023 SCHOOL TRAVEL APPLICATIONS NOW OPEN

Applications for student travel in 2023 opened on Monday 10 October 2022.

<u>Students who need a School Opal card or travel pass for 2023 can apply</u> now. A new application will need to be submitted if they are applying for the first time, or if they are requesting an additional travel entitlement as a result of a new shared parental responsibility situation (e.g. joint custody).

Students who change address, school, campus location, have repeated a year or received an expiry notification from Transport for NSW for their school travel entitlement should renew or update their details before **the end** of term 4.

This will ensure that schools can endorse applications, and entitlements remain valid for the start of the 2023 school year. School Opal card holders will have the changes applied to their existing card.

If a student's distance eligibility has changed based on their grade (i.e. grade two to grade three), the system will automatically update their entitlement if they meet the new criteria. If they do not meet the new eligibility criteria, we will send an expiry notification via email.

Students who have an entitlement approved under a medical condition that is due to expire will receive a notification advising them to re-apply.

Term Bus Pass holders will receive a notification to re-apply.

Students in the Opal network applying for an Opal card (including a Term Bus Pass) for the first time will receive their Student Opal card at their nominated postal address. Cards will be mailed out from January 2023.

CANCELLATION OF DENTIST VISIT

We have unfortunately had to cancel the dentist visit that was arranged for this term. Any notes/permission slips that were completed will be securely destroyed. Sorry for any inconvenience.

CLASSES FOR 2023

The school will shortly commence the annual process of forming class cohorts for next year.

Teachers and school leadership have extensive knowledge of how children **learn** and **relate** in their current classes and in the playground. All this information is carefully considered in the discernment process used to form **balanced class groups** across each grade.

If you have a **significant** consideration, not including a friendship request, you are required to put the request **in writing** (not email) to the Principal stating the child's name, child's present class, your request and briefly the reason for the request.

It is important that parents understand that this is not an opportunity to make any teacher requests or state any preferences for next year.

Parental requests will be reviewed in light of the school's class formation process and there is no guarantee that requests will be granted. There are many factors, which affect the placement of students - parental requests being just one of these.

Parents and caregivers are asked to **respect** the decisions made and **trust** that the school has taken all factors into consideration in the best interest of each child.

For requests to be considered, they must be received at the school office **no later than Monday 7th November, 2022.**

CHANGE OF SCHOOL IN 2023

To estimate enrolments for 2023, it would be appreciated if the school could be notified in writing, of any children who may be leaving St Francis of Assisi at the end of the year from grades other than Year 6. Thank you.

STEP 3

Click on 'Order Photos' and complete your details and procedures. During this process you can place orders for additional children at your school and sibling photos, if available





cash/envelope ordering

Your school prefers orders to be placed online. However, if you are unable to order online, please complete your order using the order envelope provided.

STEP 1

Complete a separate order envelope for each individual child's package/s ordered. If ordering for more than one child, payment should be enclosed in the envelope of the eldest child and this should be indicated on the envelope of the other child/children (the envelope that does not have cash enclosed).

STEP 2

Enclose exact cash payment in one envelope for the package/s you are ordering. Payment for more than one child should be in the eldest child's envelope and marked at the bottom of the envelope in the space provided.



Return your completed envelope/s, with correct cash payment, to our photographers on the day.

Please note: You must enclose exact correct payment, as change is not available. Credit card payments can only be made online and we no longer accept cheques. There is a separate envelope for sibling photo orders, should your school choose to offer sibling photos.

School photographs will be returned to your school 4-6 weeks after the day of photography

IMPORTANT - "not for publication" students

If you have instructed your school that your child's image is "not for publication" (sometimes called "do not publish" or "not for media release" instructions), the school will ensure that your child is not presented to our photographers on photo day and school photographs will not be available for purchase. If you wish to change your instruction, then you must notify your school, so they change their records and identify your child as able to be photographed for school photography purposes. All students presented to our photographers by your school on photo day will be photographed, their images will appear in school photography packages with their fellow students and these packages will be available to purchase by all families.

STANDARD 8: PHYSICAL AND ONLINE ENVIRONMENTS MINIMISE THE OPPORTUNITY FOR ABUSE OR OTHER KINDS OF HARM TO OCCUR

AIM: Risks to children in physical and online environments are identified and minimised



WHY IS THIS STANDARD IMPORTANT?

Safe environments, both physical and online, play a big role in preventing abuse from occurring.

Perpetrators use situations where they can be alone with children, or use online environments to extend their influence and connection.

Increased opportunities for harm occur in organisations that have areas without lines of sight by other adults or without behavioural expectations when interacting with children in person or online.

Mitigating risks in physical and online environments can increase the likelihood that perpetrators are prevented from abusing children.

What should CEDP be doing?

- Identification of risky physical or online environments helps to mitigate risk - without compromising a student's right to privacy and healthy development.
- Use of Codes of Conduct and relevant policies when using online environments.

- Staff are inducted and given regular updates on appropriate behaviours, and those to avoid, when interacting and engaging with children and students.
- Annual mandatory compliance programs including Safeguarding facilities audit requirements which address specific types of safeguarding risks in relation to the physical environment of schools.
- Policies and Procedures outline expectations of online use:
 - Responsible use of ICT and Social Media (Students) Guidelines
 - Acceptable use of ICT and Social Media (Staff) Guidelines
 - Video Conferencing Guidelines for Teachers and Students guidelines for safe use of technology during video conferencing. Guidelines available for access by staff, parents and students.
 - CEDP's Code of Conduct When Working with Children and Students
 - · CEDP's Code of Conduct
- Strict online authentication requirements, access to ICT systems and web content filtering on CEDP networks.
- Responding to Student, Staff and Parent/Carer feedback from the Tell Them From Me survey specifically in relation to eSafety and understanding of online environments.
- Regular reviews are conducted in regard to policies and procedures pertaining to the acceptable use of ICT.
- Partnership with the eSafety Commissioner to provide training and education opportunities so staff, students and parents/carers can identify unsafe online environments.
