No qualifications are needed because a conversation could change a life!

R U OK? is an Australian non-profit suicide prevention organisation, founded by advertiser Gavin Larkin in 2009. It revolves around the slogan "R U OK?" and advocates for people to have conversations with others. The organisation has a dedicated **R U OK? Day**, held annually on the second Thursday of September, which encourages Australians to connect with people who have emotional insecurity, to address social isolation and promote community cohesiveness.

The R U OK? overall mission is to guide people on when and how to have a meaningful conversation with someone in their world who might be struggling.

Their research has found that four in ten Australians feel asking someone "are you OK?" is a conversation better had with an expert. However, R U OK? want you to know you don't need qualifications to have an R U OK? conversation. The work of health professionals is vital, and their value cannot be underestimated, however, we can all play a role in supporting the people in our world.

You don't need to be an expert to have an R U OK? conversation. Listening and giving someone your time might be just what they need to help them through a difficult time or situation.

For students, learning how to support their peers and talk about how they feel is an important life lesson, so where better to start than in the classroom?

The St Francis community will participate in R U OK? activities on Monday 12th September centered around friendships, network supports and learning to ask R U OK? The activities will inspire and empower students to meaningfully connect with the people around them and start a conversation with those in their world who may be struggling with life.

Activities for each grade will be centered around the following themes;

Kindergarten: Being a good friend Year 1: Learning to ask R U OK? Year 2: When to ask R U OK?

Year 3: Identifying people to talk to

Year 4: Network supports / The key to being a good friend

Year 5: Asking R U OK? The good way Year 6: The continuum of feelings

YEAR 2 & 3 - GOOD SHEPHERD CHURCH VISITS

Last week, Year 2 and Year 3 students visited the Good Shepherd Parish to deepen their connection with the Church.

This term, through their learning cycle, the Year 2 students have had the opportunity to develop an understanding and appreciation of the Church as a special community described as God's family. Students have been learning that the Church is called to be a community:

- that is God's family,
- that celebrates God's love,
- that proclaims the Good News of Jesus
- where Mary, the mother of Jesus, has a special place in our hearts.

During their visit, Year 2 learned the features of the Church including symbols, important furniture such as the altar, tabernacle, pews etc.

Our Year 3 students have been learning about the Mission of the Church. They were able to have a close look at what is inside a Church and learn more about how sacred words and sacramental objects help them to understand and live out the Gospel. Father Vincy spoke to Year 3 about how they are the 'Church' and what they can do to live out the mission of the Church. During their unit, Year 3 have also been learning about The Pentecost Story and The Parable of the Sower. Father Vincy deepened their understanding of the Scripture passages with engaging explanations.

Both grades had the opportunity to have their personal questions answered! If you ask them what they liked the most, we believe that many would say that they got the opportunity to see the adult baptismal font! That was exciting, even for the staff who attended!
